

Costs of Climate Change

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What are the costs?

Direct and indirect costs

The costs of climate change are both **direct** (e.g., infrastructure damage, healthcare, and disaster relief costs) and **indirect** (e.g., decreased property values and increased insurance costs). At the same time, climate change may limit government revenue due to decreasing real estate values, business revenues, and household income. These costs may impact markets and financial instruments.

U.S. Billion-Dollar Weather and Climate Disasters 1980-2024

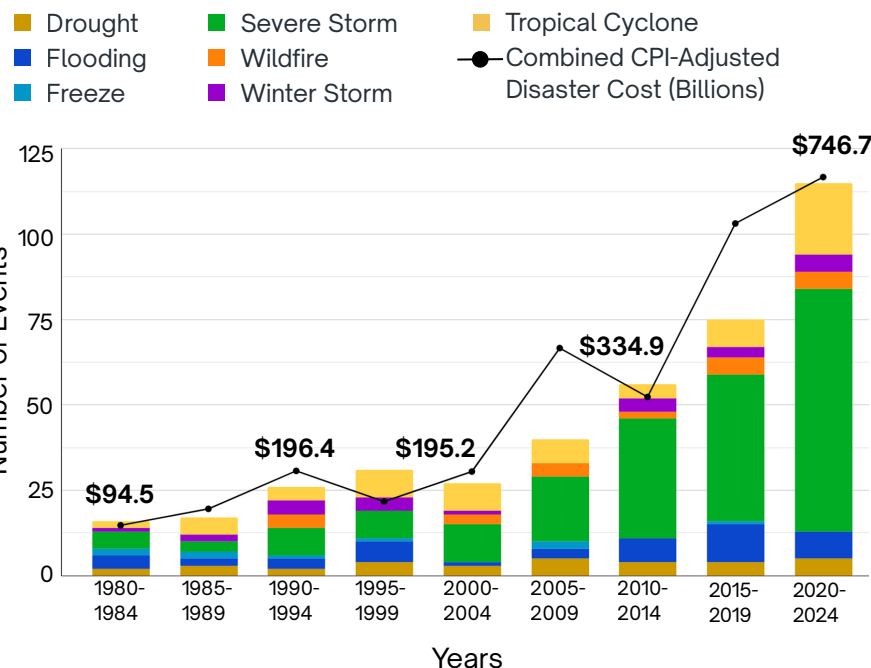
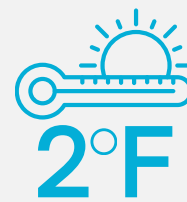
